#### From Pastor Caroline

This has been a year of change, a year of exploration and adaptation and experimentation. We have tried things that we never thought we would—YouTube and Zoom and worship out on the lawn. The proverb, "necessity is the mother of invention," has shown us that there are alternate ways of doing things and that we can do hard things, bold things, as we do our best to love God and love our neighbors. I am incredibly proud of our congregation.

I have spoken in recent sermons about the biblical stories of the exile and the return, those 70 years of people being apart, away from what was familiar, and how those stories feel so much more relevant to us now than ever before. I knew about those stories, the prophecies of Jeremiah and Ezekiel, the books of Ezra and Nehemiah. But that was history, not lived experience. Now we have been living in a kind of exile ourselves and we are still just scratching the surface of what it will mean for us to have lived through this pandemic time, where all of us are figuring out when and how to come back together as a community.

Yet as hard as some of this might feel, I know that it has been done before. We can do it too. We will come back together and we will hear each other's stories and honor them. We will find our way forward, knowing that the world in front of us looks nothing like the world behind us. We'll keep learning and adapting and growing, with the help of the Holy Spirit.

At our special congregational meeting on March 21, we voted to replace our HVAC system, take out a bank loan of up to \$500,000 as interim project financing, and raise \$700,000 thru a HVAC Replacement Financing Campaign over 5 years to finance the cost of the project plus estimated loan interest and fees. We must be able to heat and cool our building in order for us to love, learn, worship, witness, welcome and serve now and into the future. Look for more information to come about ways to support this badly needed project. And we will be continuing our visioning work, thinking about how best to use the resources of building, parking and space for mission, ministry, and service with the wider community.

"Being the church" takes all of us. Thank you for your love and support of St. John's UCC throughout this pandemic, with the gifts of time and talent and treasure that you so freely offer. None of the things we do would be possible without you, for the church is the people.

May your Easter season be filled with promise and possibility, for Jesus Christ is risen! Alleluia! Amen.

Gary and I were very pleased during the Pandemic to have several people e-mail us, and even more speak to us about really missing the music in our worship services. Spring has arrived and our thoughts turn to the outdoors and St. John's Camp. The Camp Ministries team is working toward the goal of being ready for our three (3) camps. We are working on new guidelines. Camp Rentals by the day, weekend, or week for 2021, have already been approved. Responses from the Camp Survey were mostly favorable about having camp as well as some offsite activities with indoor meals honoring safety precautions. Our Safety Plan will incorporate CDC guidelines and those of our bus company requirements. CDC guidelines for camps were updated on Jan. 1, 2021. As more people get vaccinated, we expect more current guidelines.

Our next Camp Ministries meeting will be Monday, April 5. We intend to finalize the Safety Plan and incorporate it into the registration materials. Information will be posted on our St. John's website and sent to previous campers. Previously, we had agreed to extend the eligibility by one year for the overnight camps. This was done so campers would not miss their final year at Camp Kum-Ba-Yah and Camp Galilee. Camp descriptions also were updated.
