

MUSIC VOLUNTARIES PRELUDE

Prelude — pra-lud, prel-yud, or pre-lud—An organ, instrumental or vocal composition played or sung, at the beginning of a worship service.

The prelude is a time for people to become quiet, to meditate and pray, and to prepare their hearts individually for the worship of God. If people continue to talk, they seem to be oblivious to the intent of the music. The prelude is an offering to God by the musicians on behalf of the people.

We have changed our format in the last few years and it seemed to work very well. We sing a gathering song which gets everyone's attention. This is followed by announcements and then we are told to quiet our hearts and minds with the musical prelude.

The musicians must be diligent in their own attitude and intent. They must be certain they have selected and prepared music for that Sunday, service or occasion. They must offer their music to God as an act of personal devotion and celebration and not as a performance. They must understand their role of bringing the people into an attitude of worship and meditation.

Godly Play! New Class for our Children Coming in Fall 2022

Geared especially for younger children, the Godly Play method is a curriculum of spiritual practice exploring the mystery of God's presence in our lives. The Godly Play curriculum engages what is most exciting about religious education: God inviting us into-and pursuing us in the midst of-Scripture and spiritual experience. Godly Play practice teaches us to listen for God and to make authentic and creative responses to God's call in our lives. It is a hands-on, manipulative, interactive storytelling approach. The Godly Play curriculum guides participants through self-discovery, which is fundamental to the Montessori tradition from which Godly Play developed. We are very excited to begin offering this new class for our children!



A Message from the "Caring Corner"

If you think you are tired of COVID and its restrictions, speak to someone in a care facility. Vaccines, masks, reduced visits, reduced interaction with other folks—it has not been easy. Media reports the devastating effects of isolation and lack of socialization. Do you remember 'reach out touch someone?' Many of our homebound friends would love it if we could find ways to do that!

For many of us, we have the freedom to go outside, take a trip, visit friends, and decide on our own precautions—to mask or not to mask. For many of our folks who live in a facility—this is not the case. 


FIRST FRUITS




