We have the opportunity to offer support to local families in our community with diapers and wipes. Our brothers and sisters at Central Presbyterian distribute diapers monthly to our community. They serve 180-200 families each month. They also have offered baby items, breakfasts and some food for families. We know that 1 in 3 families struggle to provide clean diapers for their babies and toddlers. Your contribution of money for diapers or wipes can go a long way to support this mission. This is 100% volunteers and diapers can be purchased by this organization at a wholesale price, so your contributions have a large impact.

#### "NOTES" FROM ONA (Open and Affirming) MINISTRY

ONA Ministry wishes to remind us of an opportunity for engagement with many others in our community on January 16, 2023 (Martin Luther King Jr. holiday). There are varied activities and times in which you can participate:

- 1) Racial Reconciliation will be hosting a thematic Day of Learning with an over-arching theme of "Why We Can't Wait", including an all-day children's/youth program at Coyle Library concurrent with a program for adults at Central Presbyterian Church. There will be workshops, lunch, entertainment and a keynote address by Dr. Tony Allen, Chair of the President's Board of Advisors on Historically Black Colleges and Universities. Registration for this event can be accessed at www.racialreconciliationfc.org/mlkday. St. John's is an official sponsor of the MLK Day of Learning.
- 2) Franklin County Coalition for Progress is also hosting an all morning "service day". Registration for this is at www.fccforprogress.org/mlk-day-of-service. Service projects will be at various locations. Lunch is included and opportunity then is available to attend the afternoon sessions of the Racial Reconciliation Day of Learning.

These events are free but do require registration. If you register by January 1, you can get a free t-shirt for the day's events. We strongly encourage you to join in this day of offerings where we can together continue to learn and serve in our community.

ONA Ministry will continue to seek ways in which we welcome and affirm those who enter our doors seeking spiritual nourishment. We also commit to reach out into the larger community to seek ways in which we benefit from the beauty of God's love in our interactions in the diversity of our larger community.
