From Pastor Caroline

The old saying "April showers bring May flowers" is certainly true this year, as we see the beautiful blooms of flowering trees and plants all around our church. We give thanks for the sunshine and rain, the warming temperatures, and the gifts of our many gardeners! God calls us to care for creation, loving and protecting our precious planet.

One of my favorite scriptures is 1 Thessalonians 5:11, "so encourage each other and build each other up, as you are already doing." In a world where tearing each other down seems to be the norm, we have the opposite task: to build each other up, to commend and praise and support each other. Paul writes in Philippians 4 about focusing on what is good and honorable and true. Valerie Kaur tells us "there is so much pain and turmoil in our world; we cannot join with it or become overwhelmed by it—we are to bring good to it, bring healing to it, with God's help and leading, in any way we can. We are live and act as though the arc of the universe bends toward moral justice." As Christians, we are called to be the church, Jesus' hands and feet in the world, moving onward and forward, being the church.

What does that really mean? I'm glad you asked! The work of the St. John's Future Together Task Force with Rev. Cameron Trimble of Convergence is focused on how we are being the church, how we live out Micah 6:8 (to do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with God) and what we can do now that will serve us well in the near future (the next 1-3 years). The themes that are emerging in our work and generating ideas and energy are: spiritual deepening, energizing participation, community impact, congregational care, and financial sustainability (leadership development has been interwoven into several of these themes).

Being the church requires us to have faith and to put that faith into action and practice. In seminary, I learned about praxis: prayer, action, and reflection. We pray and we act; we act and we pray. These two things are inseparable. And we keep learning as we go. Rev. Donna Schaper writes, "The Jesus story is not something we believe; it is something we trust." That trust in Jesus enables us to take risks, to listen deeply to one another, to build bridges rather than barriers, and to take advantage of partnerships and opportunities to increase our impact. We do not know what tomorrow will bring, but we do know what we can bring to tomorrow: love. Keep choosing love, for that is truly what Jesus taught us to do.

Thank you to everyone who participated in the April 29 workshop on Creating Healthy Congregations. Our second workshop, facilitated by Rev. Jan Nolting Carter, is Saturday, June 3, 9 am to 3 pm. This workshop will help us to respond to anxiety, manage conflict, respond to change, and plan for a healthier future. In all aspects of our lives, we can benefit from learning how to handle change and conflict in productive ways. We will offer lunch and childcare; please RSVP by Tuesday, May 30, so we can make appropriate arrangements. YOUR voice and participation are important as we continue to journey together in faith.

Please also make sure to save the date of June 4 for an all-church picnic after worship!

I am truly blessed to be your pastor. The last five years have not been easy; we have lived through a lot together. Did you know that the St. John's Called to Care Team was commissioned June 3, 2007? For Over 15 years a variety of folks have been committed to caring for members of our congregation as well as some non-members. When we are notified that someone is homebound in their private home or in a facility, is hospitalized, or has suffered a loss and would like some contact from the church, there is a team of folks who share in connecting with them. This may be through phone calls, personal visits, and/or cards.

Did you know that six of the original team of 15 continue to support Called to Care? They include Connie Evans, Lisa Frantz, Mary Moyer, Judy Patterson, Lynda Pound, and Nina Widmann. In addition to these folks, Diana Macfarlane, Carol Marotte, Eileen Schaffer, and Connie Morrill-Hair are also regular team members in support of Pastor Caroline.. And we have to mention our 'adjunct' team member, Lee Powell who visits regularly and keeps us posted.

We wanted to take a moment to share a special thanks to Connie Evans and Nina Widmann who have decided they can no longer support the visitation of our team. These two ladies have had continuous service on Called to Care for all 15+ years. What a COMMITTMENT! Connie will continue to be in the loop for our homebound and will continue to be an ambassador for St. John's in the Manor Building of Penn Hall. And Nina Widmann will continue to be an ambassador to the folks she has connected with through Called to Care and coordinate the Prayer Shawl Ministry. So they are not saying goodbye, they are simply saying it's time to let someone else play an active role in future visitation assignments!

We wanted to share with you that for Nina, it has been so rewarding to maintain personal contact with the people who she no longer sees in church. And for Connie, she credits Called to Care with helping her to be comfortable praying out loud for others and for expressing her beliefs to others. We have been so blessed to enjoy these two ladies as our teammates and our friends—thank goodness the friendship doesn't end. So to Connie and Nina a great big THANK YOU from the Called to Care Team and from St. John's church.

And of course, if you can pitch in and help with visitation, please let any member of the team know. You won't regret it.

St. John's Mission in Supporting Others in our Community

Did you know that one in every 4 Franklin County residents cannot afford basic living expenses? Poverty impacts the entire community and requires community solutions. We are fortunate to have a program via South Central Community Action Program (SCCAP) that can assist individuals overcome poverty (Circles Program).

The Circles Program builds relationships and skills in its participants that inspire and equip them to overcome poverty, helping individuals move into a long-term strategy and thus help create a more vibrant community.

St. John's supports the program in several ways:

- 1) We are providing space for the Circles Program to meet this next year in our facility on Wednesday evenings.
- 2) The Outreach Ministry and ONA (Open and Affirming) Ministry have joined to provide funds for St. John's to be a sponsor in the Race Against Poverty. This provides an opportunity for us to highlight St. John's visibility in our community.
- 3) Outreach Ministry has designated our First Fruits Offering for the month of May to support the Race Against Poverty.
- 4) St. John's has registered to have a team participate in this race event. You can do so by:

This year the *Race Against Poverty is Friday, June 2*. It provides an opportunity for you to walk, to run, as well as for children (ages 11 and under) to join the Raber Run for Kids, making this a multigenerational event in Chambersburg. 100% of the registration fees for the race goes to support the Circles Program. If you choose not to walk or run, you can simply show up and take in the energy of citizens of the Chambersburg broader community coming together for this fun and missional event. In May 2023, there are several opportunities to engage in support of these efforts.


1) 2023 Wellness Conference – Friday, **May 5** – 9:30 am. to 3:00 p.m.


