From Pastor Caroline

October is one of the "ber" months and with it comes cooler temperatures, changing colors, and conversations about what you're going to dress up for at Halloween. October is also when we celebrate World Communion Sunday and Reformation Sunday.

World Communion Sunday promotes Christian unity and ecumenical cooperation and focuses on (as the name implies) communion. Observed since 1940, we are reminded of how we are connected in Christ, regardless of our theology or denomination. This year, we will celebrate World Communion Sunday on October 1.

Reformation Sunday marks the remembrance of the start of the Protestant Reformation in 1517, as well as the continual process of forming and reforming the church. You are invited to wear red to remind you of the fire of the Holy Spirit to worship on Sunday, October 29.

These liturgical observances connect us to Christians locally and globally. We give thanks for these opportunities to engage with our past, our present, and our future.

The **Chambersburg Area CROP Walk** will be Sunday, November 5. The starting point is Zion Reformed Church, 259 South Main Street. Registration is at 1:30 pm and the walk begins at 2:00 pm. The mission of Church World Service and CROP remains the same: feed the hungry, clothe the naked, and heal the sick. Materials about CROP Walk are available at the Welcome Center. Donations will be received throughout the month of October.

Consistory had a retreat with members of the St. John's Future Together Task Force on Saturday, September 16. It was a positive start to the process of implementing our strategic plan (always the most challenging phase of any visioning process). We give thanks for the leaders among us, especially those serving on Consistory and the members of the St. John's Future Together Task Force.

None of us is called to do everything; we are all called to do something. I hope that you will say "yes" to the opportunities and possibilities that lie ahead of us as we grow in love of God and neighbor and live out our calling as Christians.

When my mama died in October 2011, my dad took a leave of absence from his job as a chaplain at the Mayflower Community and then retired. He said "I can't minister and mourn at the same time." He was 76 when she died and had been ordained 50 years by that point. He was at a very different place in his life and his ministry. I'm still at the start of my career and I have no plans to retire. But I'm trying to figure out how to minister and mourn at the same time. I wasn't in ministry when my mama died, so this is brand new territory for me. Thank you for your prayers, patience and encouragement as I find my way in this season.



What does it mean to be Open and Affirming at St. John's UCC – Chambersburg??

Almost 3 years ago, St. John's UCC voted to adopt a Covenant of Welcome and Affirmation of marginalized individuals. We seek ways to affirm those of differing sexual orientation, to learn more about our underlying mistreatment via slavery and its repercussions, to acknowledge our lack of compassion and caring of indigenous natives as our country expanded in what was believed to be creation of a 'Christian' nation in the eyes of some. And, sadly, still today we have fallen short of trying to fully understand how much of our past has led to some of our current divisiveness, and thus, often failing to find ways to affirm and serve our neighbor with understanding, compassion and assistance with basic resources in many cases.

ONA Ministry wishes to remind that we can show our support to the LGBTQ+ community by participation at the **Pride Festival on October 8 at Wilson College**. The festival runs from 12 p.m. to 5 p.m. on that date. It features a variety of family-friendly events, entertainment, quintessential Pride activities, and a mix of local and regional vendors from small and large businesses, restaurants, churches and nonprofit organizations. The goal is to lend support to the LBGTQ+ community, as well as bringing together the LGBTQ community and its straight allies to celebrate diversity, acceptance and respect. St. John's will be hosting a table at this event.

An opportunity for learning more in our history is a newly published book titled "Afro-Christian Convention: The Fifth Stream of the UCC." Many of us in the UCC denomination have not been cognizant of an early group of churches/congregations that were one of the streams of believers who were joined together in the UCC formation in 1957. The Reverend Dr. Yvonne Delk's publication of collected writings about the time in the historical formation of black churches/congregations is an informative and challenging read as we learn more about their recognition and/or lack thereof in the formation of the UCC denomination. There will be opportunity for you to participate in discussions on this book in October. The dates are October 10, 17 and 24 from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m. This will be a hybrid event allowing for in person participation in Room 111 at the church or via Zoom. The discussions will be led by Pastor Caroline and Jerry Thomason. We strongly encourage you to participate in this book discussion.
