#### From Pastor Caroline

One of my favorite passages of scripture is Ecclesiastes 3:1-8. Pete Seeger wrote the song "Turn! Turn!" based on this passage in 1959 and it became a number one hit by the Byrds in 1965. It is a reminder to me of the constancy of change. The biblical writers know the truth that comes from life: change will happen, whether we are ready or not. Enjoy life while we have it; make the most of the present moment; and embrace the possibilities.

We are living in the season after Pentecost, in the so-called "Ordinary Time." The Spirit is loose in the world, showing up in both dramatic ways and quiet moments. Some of what we do in the summer is look toward the future with anticipation, taking the time to pause and recharge after a busy program year. We center ourselves in God's grace and goodness. We might travel or take a stay-cation. We immerse ourselves in the beauty of creation. Spend some time with the Divine, nurturing your inner life, listening for God's still-speaking voice.

Consider participating in the "Prayer in Nature" event at St. John's Camp on June 8 or the Meditation Class held on Mondays at 10 am in Library Room 106. The Labyrinth outside the Sanctuary is always a good place for outdoor contemplation, accessible 24/7. These are opportunities we hope will feed your soul and allow you to tend to your spirit.

I came across this quote by Ari Honarvar and it seems to speak quite well for our times: "Perhaps the most radical act of resistance in the face of adversity is to live joyfully." There are so many things which trouble us, which cause us to worry and lose sleep. Jesus would, I believe, encourage us to choose joy. Believe there is good in the world and be the good. No wonder I love 1 Thessalonians 5:11, Philippians 4:4-9, and Micah 6:8.

Walking together, hand in hand, we are being the church. We are planting seeds that are bearing fruit, living into our Future Together Strategic Plan. Being the church takes all of us—including you. Thank you for your ideas, enthusiasm, and support. Thank you for your time, talent, and treasure. Together, we are being equipped for ministry, growing in love of God and neighbor.

Our Spring Congregational Meeting will be held on Sunday, June 23, following worship. This will be a hybrid meeting in our Sanctuary with the option to attend on Zoom.



- Family Fun Day returns on September 8th


#### FINANCIAL SUSTAINABILTY

- Camp Ministry has developed a new rental fee structure. A grant was received from Penn Central Conference to assist campers and camp upgrades.

- To assist us in applying for grants, St. John's has engaged Ghost Writer LLC with several grant applications submitted

"When I read scripture and church history, I see God working through adversity so often and calling people to abide in faith when outcomes are not certain and when the winds of the world feel like there's no way forward ... I believe that God is using constraint in churches all over. That financial constraint is compelling congregations to pick up their feet and do more of what they've been called to do all along ... Could God not use financial constraint to generate creativity? When you have a power outage and everything in the refrigerator goes bad, you start getting creative about what's in the pantry and discover you can make some pretty great things. That's when the creativity happens, not when you can just go to the refrigerator anytime you want and pull out something that's ready to eat ... And that's where I feel like there's really God's genius at work in this because it's not even just creativity for its own sake or meeting the needs of the world, it's also compelling a greater fidelity to the New Testament vision of the spirit working through many members. You can't be dependent on one professional Christian to do it all for the people anymore. There has to be more collective effort. There has to be more trust in this. There has to be more relevance. You have to have missional impact. You can't be an island. And the economic constraints are forcing all of this to be born. And it's good for the churches to have these constraints because ... when you start talking about money, people do notice. People take their budget seriously. So if that's what the people need to get them going in a path of faith, let it be so. To God be the glory."



Did You Know. . .

That among all the designated "Awareness" days and months throughout the year, there is a plethora of recognitions, including for the month of June: International Day of Action for Elephants in Zoos (June 8); International Lynx Day (June 11); National Cougar Day (June 12) and National American Eagle Day (June 20). You can spend hours surfing the internet and find almost anything or any group gaining awareness at some point in the calendar year.

St. John's ONA and Outreach Ministries wish to highlight some special dates and activities for the month of June 2024 here in our local community. As we move forward in our efforts to be engaged in community, we call these to your attention:

1) June is PRIDE month and June 26 is LGBTQ+Equality Day.



2) National holiday "Juneteenth" is officially June 19. The local Juneteenth celebration here in Chambersburg will be held on June 22nd at the Mike Waters Park on Second Street. This event will take place from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. Details of this event will be forthcoming.

3) June 23rd is ONA Sunday in the UCC denomination. St. John's will be joining other UCC churches across the nation highlighting our support and welcoming to marginalized individuals. As an ONA church, we strive to demonstrate this care and welcome throughout the entire year, and wish to join the other UCC churches in our nation on this denominational day of recognition in our worship.

4) Race Against Poverty will be held on Friday, June 7. Funds from this event go towards support for the Circles Program, where families meet together, share together, and set goals to assist in moving out of poverty and become further contributing citizens to a thriving community.



So, as we may recognize and appreciate diversity in the elephants, the lynx, the cougars and the eagles as part of God's creation, may we also find ways to engage in many of our local activities and events in efforts to experience the wonders and love of diversity in our own locale.

# First Fruits

Outreach Ministry's First Fruit collection for June will be donated to the Fayetteville Food Pantry. The Food Pantry is hosted in St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church Fayetteville and is operated in partnership with the South-Central Community Action Programs (SCCAP). St. Paul supports the operation and management of the small emergency food pantry which is stocked with nonperishable foods. St. Paul members provide volunteer staffing and receives considerable support, both volunteer labor and financial, from Fayetteville and surrounding communities. The food pantry serves approximately 120-130 families in the Brownsville, Fayetteville, North Mont Alto and South Mountain communities. The food is available to anyone who has a need and there are no eligibility requirements. This pantry is entirely financed and stocked through local donations. Hours of operation are the 2nd and 3rd Thursday of each month from 12 PM – 2 PM. The Fayetteville Food Pantry provides a valued service to the aforementioned communities, especially in these continuing inflationary times. The Outreach Ministry appreciates your contributions to this worthy local charitable organization.




