From Pastor Caroline

In 2019, I applied for and was accepted into the Next Generation Leadership Initiative (NGLI) program of the UCC Pension Boards. I've talked a lot about NGLI over the years, both the learning opportunities it has given me and the colleagues who have been there for me as we pastored during a pandemic and this post-pandemic period. I am now in the second phase of the program, and in December created my own learning covenant wherein I reflect on and articulate my current capacities as a transformation leader.

One of the things that I discovered during the community interviews part of our strategic planning work was a passion for community development from a Christian perspective. This feels particularly relevant as we look toward how we utilize our space (building and grounds) to meet the needs of others in our community. I'm really excited to welcome Jessica and Friends into our building (see page 8) and to consider other partnerships we can form that continue our mission to grow in love of God and neighbor. Local colleagues Rev. Scott Bowerman and Ben Raber have both introduced me to the work of the Christian Community Development Association (CCDA) and have recommended I attend their annual conference, which I plan to do this fall in Portland, OR.

One of the other things that I identified in my Learning Covenant was to fill my own cup (take care of me) and participate in justice work that has a creative and artistic focus. I have long wanted to attend the Wild Goose Festival in Union Grove, North Carolina. I will be away July 9 to 15 for this opportunity that I anticipate will be filled with music and art, as well as powerful and prophetic speakers. Tending to my own soul is necessary so that I can continue doing the work of pastoral ministry without it coming at the cost of myself.

I will have the joy of attending Wild Goose alongside my good friend and colleague, Rev. JT Hills, and seeing another of our NGLI cohort, Rev. Christopher Czarnecki, who serves as the pastor of Holy Covenant UCC in Charlotte, NC. I am excited to hear Jim Wallis and Rev. Dr. Jacqui Lewis, to connect with old friends and make new ones, to engage my senses and try not to get eaten by mosquitos. Many thanks to Rev. Bob Macfarlane for leading the Saturday Service on July 13 and Rev. Peter Emig for leading worship on Sunday, July 14, so that I can be away to have these experiences.

The Christian mystic Rev. Howard Thurman, noted for his book *Jesus and the Disinherited* (1949), reminds us to focus on what makes us come alive. The poet Mary Oliver says "Tell me, what it is you plan to do with your one wild and precious life?" ("The Summer Day")

I still don't know exactly what I'm going to do with the rest of my life, but I know this to be true: I choose love.



FINANCIAL SUSTAINABILTY

Welcoming Jessica and Friends to St. John's!

Several months ago, Consistory voted to engage Berkstresser Realty to advertise rooms in our building that were left vacant when First Start Partnerships opened their own location on LWE (the old Lincoln Lanes building). This partnership has yielded fruit in the form of a new tenant: Jessica and Friends.


Jessica and Friends is a faith-based organization that provides services and support for individuals and families with autism and intellectual disabilities. Their values of inclusion, virtue, empowerment, development, collaboration, unity, and honesty align well with our church's values expression in our mission and vision statements and our Covenant of Welcome and Affirmation. Jessica and Friends started in York and they are expanding their services, both community-supported living (SCL) and a day program in Franklin and Fulton Counties.

St. John's UCC will provide space for an adult day program run by Jessica and Friends. They are still in the process of setting up security, internet, and other infrastructure needs before welcoming persons-served into our building later this year (the exact timeframe is still TBD).

This partnership is a win-win, providing a safe and secure environment for an underserved population while also generating income from rooms that were otherwise not being used (~\$2000/month). Jessica and Friends will utilize one of the large classrooms for programming and an upstairs room for office space.

We are excited by this new venture and how we can continue to live into our commitment to love, learn, worship, witness, welcome and serve all who come through our doors.





Report on the Penn Central Conference Annual Meeting

I had the great joy of participating in the shared four-conference Annual Meeting held June 7-9 in State College. With worship and workshops, business meetings and plenary sessions, it was a lot like a mini-General Synod. Clergy and laypeople from across the Commonwealth converged at the Penn Stater Hotel and Conference Center as we gathered to explore what it might mean to be one Keystone Conference.

Currently, we have four UCC Conferences in Pennsylvania: Penn West, Penn Central (us), Penn Northeast, and Penn Southeast. These Conferences were part of the original structure of the UCC when we were formed in 1957. Times have changed and it is time to consider what models will serve us well into the future. As someone told me several years ago, "we can't live in what used to be."

The proposed Keystone Conference would bring together churches across the state into one Conference, with a new staff model helping to support the work of Associations and the local church. Over the last two years, the Keystone Working Group met to consider what is possible, what is practical, and what God might be calling us into. This shared Annual Meeting provided time to wonder together as delegates of our churches, no matter what conference we are part of, and to engage in honest dialogue about what we would gain, as well as what we might lose, by joining together as one Conference.

I continue to be inspired by the efforts of the Keystone Working Group and the stirrings of the Holy Spirit as we lean into the next phase of what it means to be the church in our wider church work and all settings of the church.

While no votes were taken (that will happen in November), it was an important event in the life of our church and in the work and witness we are all called to undertake.

As a member of the Penn Central Conference Board of Directors, I'm grateful for the work of our conference staff and all of the clergy and lay leaders who have faithfully and prayerfully engaged in discerning what our future might hold.

Attending the shared Annual Meeting also provided me with time and space to spend time with colleagues, form new relationships, see old friends, and be inspired by worship services filled with music and preaching that lifted us up.

Thank you again to Eileen Shaffer for her leadership on Sunday, June 9, allowing me to fully participate in the worship life of the wider church.

May we journey together "Into the Unknown" (as Rev. Dr. Karen Georgia Thompson, UCC General Minister and President said in her sermon at State College), knowing that Jesus is praying for us and leading us on.
