

#### From Pastor Caroline

Thank you so much for the blessing of six weeks of sabbatical this summer! My time from June 30 to August 10 was rejuvenating, restful, and relaxing. I feel that I have indeed been able to refocus and recharge – just in time for the start of the program year!

My sabbatical time was filled with books and podcasts, cuddles with cats, connecting with friends and colleagues, and travel to spend time with family and serve the wider church. I put several thousand miles on my car, driving first to Iowa to see my brother and dear friends and then to Kansas City, MO to serve as a delegate to General Synod. I ate really good BBQ, rode the KC Wheel, and even visited Whiskers Cat Café, all while attending worship services, workshops, plenary (business) sessions, and committee meetings. The work of the church is made possible by those who participate in all of its various settings. I love going to UCC General Synod; in many ways, it is like attending a family reunion, as I get to see people from all the areas I've lived and reconnect with people who knew my parents.

I flew out to Denver, CO and spent time with my Aunt Gretchen, cousins Julie and Andy and their families, and took many hikes in the foothills of the Rocky Mountains. It was my first trip to CO since 2012 and it was so good to have time with family when no one was in crisis. It's always good to be with people in times of joy, not just in times of stress and/or sorrow.

Rest and renewal are critical for all of us, especially those of us in the helping professions. I believe that this time will indeed prove fruitful for my ministry with me: contributing to my spiritual growth, preventing burnout, establishing new patterns for work and self-care, and promoting congregational self-sufficiency. Now, as the calendar turns to September, we are gearing up for more activities, programs, and continued opportunities to live into the themes, goals, and action steps of our Future Together Strategic Plan: spiritual life, energizing participation, community engagement, congregational care, and financial sustainability. Church school classes for all ages begin on Sunday, September 7. Book study on Monday afternoons resumes on Monday, September 8. Bell choir and vocal choir rehearsals resume on Thursday, September 11. Our Habitat for Humanity Book Sale needs donations and volunteers; we'd love this year to be our most successful yet.

We have been evaluating options to redo the curbing around our property in high-usage areas (such as along the sanctuary) and to fix our parking lots. The Council is aware that this is a project that needs attention AND is not going to become less expensive. We will hold a special congregational meeting to vote on this project on Sunday, September 21. See the "Focus on Finance" article on page 5 for more details.

Assata Shakur wrote that "We must love each other. We must protect each other." Her words have been echoing in my prayers, as we seek to stand with the most vulnerable, to be in solidarity with our immigrant friends and neighbors, and to be Jesus' hands and feet in this world. # SPECIAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING concerning fixing our parking lots

### SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 21, 11 AM

### Focus on Finance - September 2025

For the past several months, Council has been exploring the much needed repairs of our parking lots and improving our curbing to become more accessible for people with mobility concerns, including the congregation, community members, and tenants. The estimated cost of this combined project is \$200,000 to \$250,000 and requires congregational approval. But before we can move forward, we need to discuss the financial implications and methods to pay for it.

Let's start with existing cash/investments and our HVAC debt as of July 31.

Unrestricted cash/money market/CD's	\$245,000
Cash designated for HVAC loan pay down	\$25,000
Estimated HVAC donations through 2026	<u>\$51,000</u>
	\$321,000
HVAC debt service (assumes payment over next 5 years)	
Principal	\$138,000
Interest	<u>\$15,000</u>

While on the surface it appears we have plenty of funds to pay off the HVAC loan (which matures in July 2031), the reality is we DO NOT suggest using any of our existing unrestricted cash since that is our "cash reserve" necessary to support our annual budget of approximately \$500,000. The hope would be that donations continue to come in for the HVAC campaign over the next few years to get the debt paid off. It also should be noted that our 3.75% fixed rate will expire in July 2026 and move to a variable rate, which will certainly result in a noticeable rate increase. The assumptions above use a rate of 5.5% from July 2026 until the debt is fully paid off in approximately October 2030. It would, of course, be advantageous to pay off the current loan while the interest rate is 3.75%.

As for the new project, it would seem logical to "borrow" the needed funds from our Trust Fund, which holds \$744,000 at July 31. This would result in no interest costs, but we would give up the earnings on these funds. Then we could discuss the options to try and "repay" the Trust Fund from designated donations. We are in the process of applying for a grant to help with the curbing, though we anticipate that this funding would be limited to ~\$10,000.

Council has had extensive discussions about the fact that (1) the issues with the parking lot are going to continue to worsen and (2) fixing the parking lot will not get less expensive.

A special congregational meeting to vote on (1)<sup>5</sup> approving this project and (2) funding the project internally by borrowing from our Trust Fund will be held on **Sunday, September 21**.



### St. John's Nursery School

St. John's Nursery School has just began its 54th year of providing quality early childhood education to children in our community!

We have been blessed to welcome 125 children and their families this school year. We have 18 toddlers, 47 three year olds, and 60 four and five year olds excited to learn and have fun!

We welcome back our teachers: Lisa Etter, Angie Leedy, Katlyn Heverley, Charon Barclay, and Shanna Bell, along with our assistants: Chazalynn Hackney, Vanessa Florea, Megan Ritter, Nicole Arnett, and Amy Rosenberry. Joining us this year is teacher Elizabeth Clark and assistant Adrienne Grossberg, who will be running our 2-year-old classes. We are all looking forward to a fantastic school year!

Thank you in advance for your support of our Nursery School and a special thanks to the Nursery School Ministry for their outpouring of support, encouragement, and direction in planning this new school year.

#### **COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT**


- The Wired Word Church School class has provided snacks for NETwork Ministries

Check out News in the Pews for each week's reading assignment. Everyone is welcome.



### An Update from Jessica & Friends Community:

The Lord is so good! The dream and process of venturing into Franklin County, Chambersburg area began in 2023. After much anticipation and dedication, our Pathway Services, Chambersburg was provided license on July 18, 2025. We have a beautiful facility for programming located at 1811 Lincoln Way East, Chambersburg, Pennsylvania in the back of St. John's United Church of Christ. Pathway Chambersburg is part of Jessica and Friends Community, a non-profit 501(c) (3) organization which also offers Home & Community Services in the Chambersburg area for individuals with developmental disabilities.

Services in Franklin County will provide caring support for individuals with intellectual disabilities within a faith-based environment as well as opportunities in lifelong I earning, vocational training and employment opportunities. Programming prepares developmentally disabled adults 18 years of age and older to live and function in various settings by promoting independence in daily living, social integration, and responsible decision –making. It further promotes the development of each individual's uniqueness and individuality to enable them to become productive, contributing members of the community. From on-the job-training to supported volunteerism and employment, the staff will seek to identify interests, build skills, and assist individuals on their own "path to potential" to achieve their life goals.


