#### From Pastor Caroline

My parents were both big collectors of vinyl records. For years, they were kept in boxes, stored away. When we moved to Grinnell in 2000, we bought a record player and started playing those LPs. Ironically enough, I discovered multiple duplicates and a few real gems. Classical, Broadway musicals, and folk music were the top genres. I donated most of those records when my dad moved into assisted living and kept the ones that I loved. Every now and then, I'll put a record on and listen to the music that nurtured my parents—and me.

Folk musicians such as Woody Guthrie, Pete Seeger, Odetta, Joan Baez, and The Weavers evoke the artistic potential to name the need for change: to prioritize people over profits, love over hate, peace over war, and generosity over greed. So while these songs aren't new, their power to speak to us has not changed. We just might need to listen to them again.

I'm trying to limit how much social media I consume, the TV I watch, and even the podcasts I listen to—because I want my heart to be open, my mind flexible, and my spirit brave. And if you're feeling overwhelmed (and many of us are these days), don't forget to eat good food, drink enough water, and get enough sleep. Exhaustion won't serve any of us well. Sabbatical surely taught me that!

The Byrd's hit song "Turn, Turn, Turn" from 1965 feels especially appropriate as we enter into October and fully into fall. Everything keeps turning, including the calendar! October is filled with many options for fun, fellowship, learning, service, worship, and welcome.

Every Sunday this month has something special: October 5 is World Communion Sunday and our Chili Cook Off Fundraiser (sign up at the Welcome Center or on a bulletin board). October 12 is an Immunization Clinic for Flu and COVID vaccines (see pg. 17 for details) and the annual Franklin County Pride Festival at Wilson College (12-5 pm). October 19 is CROP Walk (see pg. 14 for details) and October 26 is the last day of our Book Sale (pg. 16). We'll have our annual "No Tricks, Just Treats" event on October 31; candy donations are needed, as we have lots of kids in the neighborhood who stop by. Plus: we have multiple opportunities each week to build community, deepen our spiritual lives, study and pray. If there is something that YOU would love to do, and it aligns with our mission, vision, and values, contact Pastor Caroline or a Council member for support to make it happen!

Pick up a copy of the draft "Holy Manners for our St. John's United Church of Christ Faith Community" and read the article on page 13 to learn more about a Behavioral Covenant. Opportunities to offer feedback will be held this fall; we hope to adopt this covenant at the Fall Congregational Meeting on Sunday, November 9, as well as approve the 2026 budget.

## To God Be the Glory!

"To God Be the Glory" is a phrase that expresses gratitude and praise to God for His greatness and the wonderful things He has done. It emphasizes the belief that all achievements and blessings should be attributed to God, reflecting a spirit of worship and acknowledgment of His power and love.

"To God Be the Glory" is a hymn that many of you know with lyrics by Fanny Crosby and music by Howard Doane, first printed in 1875. It was published in Robert Lowry and Doane's hymn compilation, "Brightest and Best."

Billy Graham included it in the songbook for a London Crusade. It was so well-loved that he included it again later that year in the Crusade in Nashville, Tennessee. The audience responded enthusiastically and from that time on, he used it frequently. With this exposure, the hymn quickly became well-known to Christians worldwide and is printed in most modern hymnals.

I neglected to say that it is also one of my favorite hymns! Our choir sang it on September 14<sup>th</sup> in church and we also used an arrangement of this hymn in our Summer Singers programs this past summer.

#### **COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT**



Check out News in the Pews for each week's reading assignment. Everyone is welcome.





## "Holy Manners for Our St. John's United Church of Christ Faith Community"

First introduced to SJUCC during a workshop on Healthy Congregations, the idea of a Behavioral Covenant has been part of our Future Together Strategic Plan since Fall 2023. Under the stewardship of Lloyd Beers and Connie Morrill-Hair, a draft of "Holy Manners for Our St. John's United Church of Christ Faith Community" (a Behavioral Covenant) has been developed. This summer, members of the Wired Word class helped to shape this document—and now it comes to the congregation. Copies of the drafted document are available in the Narthex and by request from the church office.

#### What is a behavioral covenant?

A behavioral covenant is a written compact between an organization and its members that serves as a formal, binding agreement regarding personal, interpersonal and organizational conduct. In other settings, similar agreements take the form of policy documents. Examples include; Code of Conduct, Code of Ethics, Workplace Behavior or Community Guidelines, Principles of Integrity, just to name a few. In organizational settings, these published behavioral expectations presume civil and professional behavior on the part of individuals and the organization.

## What is a behavioral covenant designed to do?

The St. John's UCC behavioral covenant entitled "Holy Manners for Our St. John's United Church of Christ Faith Community" is designed to promote a positive, caring environment by offering a framework for civil behavior and holy manners in all personal and group interactions. The covenant also serves as a reminder of our responsibilities where instances of disagreement arise. In a time in which divisions are increasing, we at St. John's UCC seek to come together in unity (not uniformity) as a church community, and walk and work with one another in love.

## How it will a behavioral covenant encourage us to be our best selves?

As a document grounded in scripture, "Holy Manners" calls us to reflect the teachings of Jesus and his disciples, and to commit to the greatest commandments. By agreeing to the ten items contained in the covenant, we, as a congregation, are called to love one another, unite as a family, welcome everyone, practice and promote truth, respect, and understanding in communication, and be personally responsible in avoiding conflict. Finally, we are called to act with peace and love for the wellbeing of the congregation. "Holy Manners for Our St. John's United Church of Christ Faith Community" is a solemn covenant that acknowledges our belief in God, our bond in Christ, the guidance of the Holy Spirit, and strength of our family united in faith.


## Help is Needed to Maintain our Labyrinth!

St. John's UCC is blessed to have an outdoor prayer labyrinth, located off the north end of the Sanctuary. A labyrinth is an ancient symbol that relates to wholeness. It combines the imagery of the circle and the spiral into a meandering but purposeful path. The labyrinth represents a journey to our own center and back again out into the world. Labyrinths have long been used as meditation and prayer tools. St. John's labyrinth was installed in 2013 and we celebrated its ten year anniversary in 2023. Now, we **need your help** in order to preserve its beauty and functionality. 
