From Pastor Caroline

Bishop Deon K. Johnson of the Episcopal Diocese of Missouri wrote this for Ash Wednesday in 2024: "Remember you are dust, the substance of the stars, animated with the Breath of Life. Uniquely formed in the image and likeness of Divine Love. Authored in hope, forged in joy, very good of very good, no accident we, this beloved quickened dust, knit to love and be loved. Remember you are dust. Amen."

The liturgical season of Lent lasts 40 days (+ Sundays) and always begins with this reminder of our mortality: that we are dust. Yet we are not ordinary dust; we are beloved. We are made in the image of God. And God calls us very good.

The Sunday night Bible study recently started reading Esther. The book "inspires readers by giving them hope, making them laugh, and causing them to envision a world where those with very little power triumph over evil officials bent on destroying God's people" (Matthew Richard Schlimm, CEB Student Bible). This is the work of imagination, the will to dream, and the courage to care. It feels especially appropriate to now be studying Esther.

Retired Episcopal Bishop Michael Curry reminds us, "There's power in love. There's power in love to help and heal when nothing else can. There's power in love to lift up and liberate when nothing else will. There's power in love to show us the way to live."

My own devotional practice this Lenten season includes a few different resources, some that I have used before and others which are new: "Rise" by John Pavlovitz; "Outgrow" from the UCC Still Speaking Writers' Group (new for 2026); and "When Love Gets the Last Word: Daily Readings from Ash Wednesday to Easter" by Rev. Benjamin Cremer. Cremer's work is available in eBook and audiobook: <https://benjamin-cremer.kit.com/products/when-love-gets-the-last-word-a-lent-devo>. Cremer writes, "No matter how discouraging the world may be around us or how relentless violence and death seem to be, love will not only triumph and prevail but will get the last word over us all. That is the hope I want to invite you to hold onto as you travel this journey called Lent."

We are using a special Lenten curriculum called "The Work of Imagination" that builds on our Advent theme "The Will to Dream." In "The Work of Imagination," we are "encouraged to confront the pain of the world, embody faithful resistance, and participate in the holy labor of communal transformation" with honesty, hope, inspiration, and care. Friends, ancient wisdom speaks to our present moment, and together, we will explore and grow.

And when I find my anxiety and anger rising, I aim to center and ground myself in God, by using a few simple breath prayers, written by the wonderful Sarah Bessey:

Inhale: May we be loving and generous,

Exhale: compassionate and courageous.

Inhale: Hope can see in the dark,

Exhale: Give us eyes to see what is good.

Inhale: We do not wait for permission,

Exhale: we will be faithful and courageous.

Christ the Lord is Risen Today

I am writing about a hymn which we will sing on Easter Sunday. This hymn was originally written by Melchoir Teschner in 1603. The hymn tune I am writing about was originally "St. Theodulf". It was also harmonized by Johann Sebastian Bach as it appears in the New English hymnal. By the way, did you know that the "hymn tune" of each hymn has a name usually different from the title of the hymn. This name is found in the lower right corner of each hymn in our hymnal. The tune of the one I am writing about is now called "Easter Hymn" and the hymn itself is "Christ the Lord Is Risen Today". If you look on page 733 of our hymnal you will find a listing of hymn tunes. It also shows you that many times several hymns that have the same tune. So it is possible to find a familiar tune with different words than the one with which you are familiar.

I hope you find this interesting.

First Fruit Offering

GOAL: A MULTI-FOCUS FOR THE LENTEN SEASON

We entered the liturgical season of Lent with Ash Wednesday on February 18. We consider spiritual practices such as prayer, fasting, almsgiving (charitable giving), service and volunteering, reflection, and meditation. We create space in our lives for an expanded spiritual focus. Part of our Lenten practice as a community of faith is collecting funds for our Lenten projects.

We are introducing a new model this year in utilizing a 3-month span of time in which you can contribute to our Lenten offering, which support the following three recipients:

- 1) The Peru School Project—providing school supplies along with community resource support
- 2) The African Mission Healthcare—special support to pediatric surgeries, including training in this specialty
- 3) United Church of Christ Disaster Emergency Fund—support to individuals with grave loss due to unexpected events

We will have our First Fruits baskets at the back of the sanctuary on the first Sunday of March and April. All funds on those dates, along with donations made in envelopes or checks mailed, presented to the office, or in the special Lenten boxes, will go toward the total collected for these recipients.

St. John's UCC continues to reach out in loving support in acts of compassion and care.

Mission Possible HVAC Campaign Status

Let's go back in time to the June 2021 congregational meeting when we announced the fundraising campaign to pay for our new HVAC system. The following is a recap from the minutes of that meeting.

1. The fundraising campaign will run for 5 years with a goal of \$700K (to pay for the cost of the system plus loan fees and interest costs).
2. We will borrow \$500K from F&M Trust with a 10-year term at 3.75% interest (fixed for first 5 years, then variable in July 2026) and use initial campaign receipts to pay the HVAC system costs.
3. We will use campaign receipts to pay down the debt as quickly as possible with the hope to have it fully paid in 5 years.
4. Consistory approved a "silent kickoff" to jump start the campaign. This resulted in combined pledges and cash payments of \$243K, or 35% of the goal.

What is the current status Mission Possible?

The campaign "goal" was reduced to \$650K as a result of significant early donations that enabled us to pay down the debt by \$260K in 2021, thus reducing the original expected interest cost by \$50K. Due to this early principal paydown, the loan will be paid off in 2029 with normal monthly payments.

Here is a snapshot of the campaign at December 31, 2025:

Campaign Goal	\$650K
Donations received	\$532K
Budgeted donations 2026	\$14K
Shortfall from Goal	\$104K

The budgeted donations are based on known unpaid pledges plus an estimate of donations from the donors that did not make pledges.

Since the interest rate on the loan is expected to increase to over 7% in July 2026, we believe it is fiscally prudent to use existing funds to pay off the remaining debt of approximately \$107K at that time. **We are so close. Won't you help us cross the HVAC finish line?**

- End of year giving statements are available by request from the church office.


CONGREGATIONAL CARE
